SUPER MARIO REGAINS LEAGUE LEAD

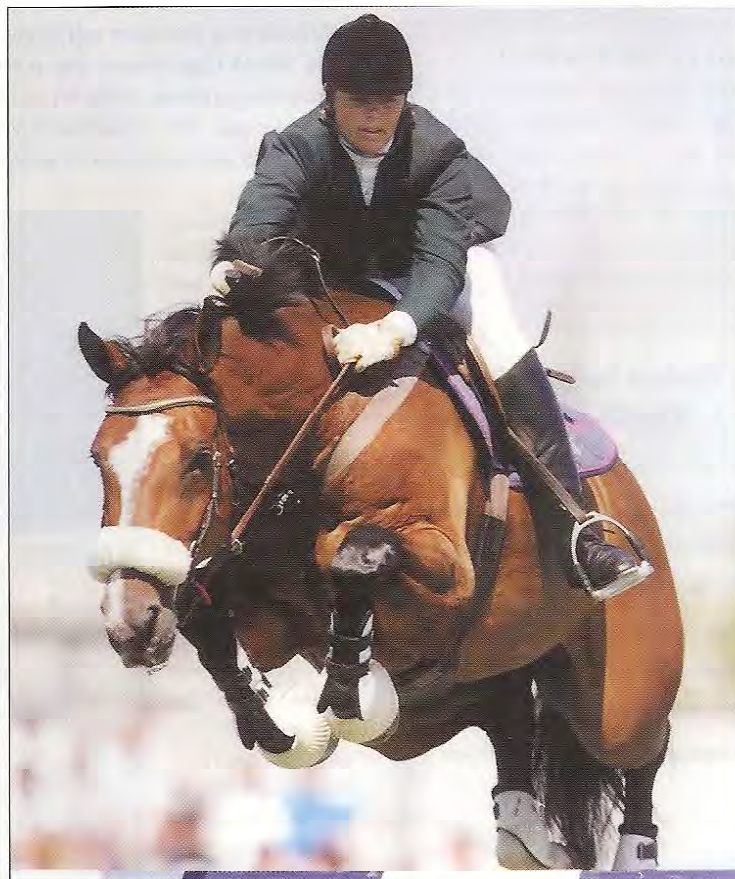
by Lamaze, earned the most World Cup points (17) for her second place finish on her new nine-year-old Hannoverian mare Ravenna Z.

The top three riders in the standings following the Royal will be invited to compete as Canada's representatives at the FEI World Cup Final in Goteborg, Sweden next April.

FEI WORLD CUP JUMPING

Lawrence share the lead with 25 points apiece after two rounds of the South African League. Lawrence won the inaugural event at the Royal showgrounds in Pietermaritzburg with Vallon Rouge after a jump-off with Greg Cleverdon (Shaluga). The next round at the Kyalami Equestrian Park in Midrand saw 12 World Cup horses competing over another Harold Preston designed course. Miranda Collings and Bambix got the measure of Errol Wucherpfennig (Sissi) and Bryce McCall (Theseus) in a three horse jump-off to win the points.

Three fixtures remain on the South African calendar with the final qualifier at Cape Town, November 30-6 December.
